When it's time for something to eat you will discover why the numerous varieties of Basque cooking enjoy worldwide recognition and the importance of the cultural scene, with its own language and multiple traditions makes Bilbao an interesting place to visit.

The Bilbao of Today

As a result of the international recognition awarded by the *Guggenheim Bilbao Museum*, the city has been able to position itself as an example of regeneration. In this environment, you will have the opportunity to appreciate Bilbao at its most cosmopolitan and modern, with its most significant museums, as well as the most recent buildings designed by well-known architects such as Cesar Pelli, Arata Isozaki, and Alvaro Siza.

MUSEUMS QUALITY

The Guggenheim Bilbao Museum, designed by Frank Gehry, was one of the most ambitious cultural projects of the 21st century. Its contemporary art collection includes works by leading artist of the second half of the 20th century, with renowned names such as Eduardo Chillida, Yves Klein, Willem de Kooning, Robert Motherwell and Andy Warhol.

Joan Miró. Absolute Reality. Paris, 1920– 1945 and Masterpieces from the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao Collection.

Bilbao Fine Arts Museum, contains important examples of ancient, modern and contemporary paintings. It has a special interest in the Spanish school of art and in Basque artists, by whom it has a large collection of works.

Itsasmuseum (Bilbao Maritime Museum),

is based on elements and objects that tell the history of maritime activity on the "Ría de Bilbao" and its port, as well as maritime culture in general, with special attention to the pieces that relate the lives and accomplishments of the men and women who made the maritime history of this town.

Besides the boats that are exhibited in the museum's dykes, there is a collection of scale model boats constructed in the famous Bilbao Estuary.

ART INSIDE AND OUT

Memorial Walkway. This space presents an open-air garden museum that can be explored in approximately 15 minutes. It is located along the river estuary with sculptures by notable contemporary artists such as: Dalí, Chillida, Koons, Bourgeois, Kapoor and Valdés among many others.



The river estuary and its bridges. Walking for the river estuary and its bridges is an option to explore the history of the city. The Zubizuri Bridge or the Arrupe footbridge are icons of the New Bilbao, while San Antón Bridge, La Merced or the Arenal bridge are great representative's symbols of the city's past.

THE BILBAO OF ALWAYS



The Cathedral of Santiago, built in the fifteenth century, in a Gothic style, is a pilgrimage point along the Northem Route of St. James'Way and it has been renovated several times, the last time in 2000.



The Arriaga Theatre is Inspired in the Paris Opera and was opened in 1890. Today, the Arriaga continuously hosts the city's programmes of music and theatre.

FOR THE FOOD LOVERS

On the other hand, the old town it is one of the emblematic places to taste the well-known "pintxos" (miniature creations that can be found in any bar) and combine with an activity known as "txikiteo" (going from bar to bar drinking small glasses of wine).

A The Azkuna Zentroa "Alhondiga Bilbao" is located just five minutes walking from Plaza Moyua. That building was formerly a wine and liquor store converted into a cultural centre in the 20th century.

The exterior classicism contrasts with the interior design by Philippe Starck, one of the most renowned designers nowadays. The atrium contains 43 columns that represent the cultures of different countries around the world.

Furthermore, it offers a wide variety of leisure services including a library, sports facilities, cinemas, and gastronomic offerings.



Metro stop: Areeta / Portugalete

The transporter bridge linking Las Arenas (Getxo) and Portugalete, declared a heritage monument by the UNESCO World Heritage

SAN JUAN DE GAZTELUGATXE

On the headland of a small rocky peninsula that juts out into the sea, between <u>Bakio</u> and <u>Bermeo</u>, rixes the magical and legendary chapel of San Juan de Gaztelugatxe.

The Gaztelugatxe biotope stands out for its beauty and its blend of the natural and the man-made. An attractive path winds steeply down from Eneperi to the base of the promontory, where a striking 3-arched bridge takes walkers across to the 241 steps that lead up to the chapel.



GIPUZKOA/GUIPÚZCOA:

The city of Donostia/San Sebastián is one of the most attractive cities in Europe. The Paseo de la Concha, from which the island of Santa Clara can be admired, proves its beauty. Its Belle Époque elegance coexists with the maritime character of its old port (Puerto Viejo). From Mount Igeldo you will get a spectacular panoramic view of the entire bay and its beaches.

The elegant Ondarreta district is also worth visiting, as is the neighbouring Peine de los Vientos (Wind Comb), the best-known work by Eduardo Chillida. In addition, the Old Quarter (Parte Vieja) of the city, where you can enjoy the pintxo bars, awaits you. Donostia is the cradle of great chefs and has exceptional cuisine on offer.

The city has been declared European Capital of Culture for 2016 and can be reached by car, by bus or, if you have time, by train.









You shouldn't miss:

- The spectacular views of the city obtained from Mount Igeldo.
- Taking a dip in the sea at the delightful La Concha beach.
- Strolling around the elegant neighbourhood of Ondarreta.
- Revelling in the youthful surfer atmosphere at Gros beach.
- Visiting the Kursaal Conference Centre, a spectacular architectural work by Rafael Moneo.
- Dropping by the Peine de los Vientos (Wind Comb), the emblematic work of Eduardo Chillida.
- Going to eat pintxos in the Old Quarter of Donostia, where the bars are an irresistible temptation.
- Visiting some of the excellent restaurants in the city, the birthplace of signature cuisine.

ARABA/ÁLAVA:

The city of Vitoria/Gasteiz is one of the most attractive cities in Europe. The Paseo de la Concha, from which the island of Santa Clara can be admired, proves its beauty. Its Belle Époque elegance coexists with the maritime character of its old port (Puerto Viejo). From Mount Igeldo you will get a spectacular panoramic view of the entire bay and its beaches.





You shouldn't miss:

- A guided tour to discover the history of the Cathedral of Santa Maria.
- Taking a stroll through La Florida Park, influenced by 19th-century French gardens.
- Exploring the network of streets that makes up the so-called Medieval Almond.
- Visiting the Plaza del Machete, one of the central points of the famous Vitoria-Gasteiz Mediaeval Market.
- Visiting the Church of San Miguel Arcángel, a Gothic-Renaissance church built mostly in the 14th century.
- Taking a tour of Salburua Park, one of the most important wetlands in Europe.
- Enjoying the merriment of the Fiestas de la Blanca, which are held in August.
- Savouring an aperitif at one of the terraces located in the Plaza de la Virgen Blanca.
- Stopping by the Vitoria-Gasteiz International Jazz Festival, one of the best in the world.
- Tasting the "vasquitos" and "neskitas", the city's typical sweets.



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
